FURTHER INFORMATION

Thai language course	Students may enroll in Thai language courses offered by Chulalongkorn University Language Institute (CULI) or other language centers in Bangkok on a fee-paying basis.
Accommodation	We assist students in arranging accommodation. Depending on availability, exchange students may stay at CU iHouse (14,000–22,000 THB/month) or nearby serviced apartments. More information: https://pmcu.co.th/?page_id=9795 Landlords typically require a deposit (1–3 months' rent) upon move-in. Rent is usually paid monthly and in advance.
Visa	Students must apply for a Non-Immigrant ED visa (education purpose) via the online E-Visa system before traveling to Thailand: https://www.thaievisa.go.th/. The application must be submitted to the Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate in their home country. Upon arrival in Thailand, students will need to complete the Thailand Digital Arrival Card (TDAC) process. Instructions will be provided after visa approval. Please note that student visas will be automatically canceled two weeks after the end of the final exam week.
Is airport pick-up service available for exchange students? If so, how can they request it?	We do not provide an arrival pick-up service. Students can get a taxi or take the airport rail link to go to the city center.
Health insurance	All students are required to purchase adequate health and liability insurance prior to their departure. In addition, students must enroll in a health insurance plan at Chula for a one time premium of THB 2,000.
Living expenses	A student will need approximately THB 20,000 per month (3 meals per day, transportation costs, and personal expenses), including accommodation and luxury items.
Tuition fee for exchange students	Exchange students will be exempted from the tuition fees at the host university, but they will be required to pay the tuition fees at their home university according to the terms and conditions of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

Tuition fee for visiting students	Visiting students must pay tuition fees within the first two weeks of enrollment. Tuition fees consist of the following: 1. university fee THB 12,250 2. faculty fee THB 42,610 3. International student insurance THB 2,000
